FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

'Waiting is learning'

A new Church Year begins. We move into the season of Advent. The word 'advent' means 'coming'. During these days we are asked to think about the coming of Christ at Christmas, His coming at the end of time, and His coming into our lives every day. In other words we look back, we look forward and we look around. It is really a four-week course in waiting. Like its cousin, Lent, it is a season for prayer and reformation.
