# **13th SUNDAY OF THE YEAR**

'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones he will most certainly not lose his reward'.

It is true that the Church will always need great orators, gifted teachers and heroic saints to inspire the multitudes and carry out its mission, but it will also need ordinary folk who live graciously, love tenderly and serve generously away from the spotlight, those who welcome the stranger and offer generous hospitality in their homes. The world actually turns on the small and seemingly insignificant acts of ordinary people. It is touching that a simple act of kindness is the image chosen by Jesus in this extract from His final instruction to His disciples. The giving of a cup of cold water in His name will not go unnoticed or unrewarded. Nothing escapes His attention and all service ranks the same with Him. There is a significance to the insignificant. 'Be great in little things' (St. Francis Xavier).

One day in 1954 in Louisville, Kentucky a police officer came upon a young boy who was fuming because someone had stolen his bicycle. 'If I catch that thief I'll whup him', shouted the boy.
