33rd SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

'Heaven and earth will pass away'

There is something about the month of November that invites us to reflect on endings and beginnings. As winter tightens its grip and the landscape becomes increasingly barren we are confronted with the stark truth that this world as we know it will pass away. The Word of God these Sundays asks us to live with this awareness. We are reminded that all life is a preparation to meet the King. One day we will stand before Him to account for our stewardship, for the choices we have made. If we have chosen wisely, the end times are not to be feared, but to be anticipated joyfully. Unwise choices have consequences also. 'If in the end we have not chosen God, then it will not matter what else we have chosen' (C.S. Lewis).
